SJM Successfully Co-hosted the Second Greater Bay Area Youth Orchestra Concert Tour in Macau

Fostering Musical Excellence Among Greater Bay Area Youth

(Macau, 10 July 2024) For the second season running, SJM Resorts, S.A. ("SJM") has co-hosted the Greater Bay Area Youth Orchestra ("GBAYO")'s concert tour in Macau. This year, the GBAYO Concert Tour 2024 – "Romancing the Dragon" at the University of Macau - University Hall (N2) concluded on 10 July to widespread acclaim. The tour features 92 top-selected musicians from Guangdong, Hong Kong, and Macau, who were recruited after a rigorous screening process and coached by world-renowned musicians. The tour commenced on 8 July at the HKAPA, with Macau serving as the second stop. The orchestra is also set to enchant audiences in Guangzhou and Shenzhen, offering a series of soul-stirring musical feasts.

Led by Sharon Andrea Choa, Professor of Conducting and Cultural Leadership at the HKAPA, the ensemble performed an eclectic mix of classic and contemporary pieces. Highlights included Bernstein's "West Side Story" Symphonic Dances, Chan Mingchi's "Dragon Roaming the Earth," Tan Dun's "Crouching Tiger Concerto 4th & 5th Movement," and Tchaikovsky's "Romeo and Juliet" Fantasy Overture - a fusion of Eastern and Western melodies that bridges the past and present, creating a truly captivating auditory experience.




