## Sensational Results for SJM Theodore Racing in 2025 Lamborghini Super Trofeo Asia Round Two

- Macau's Charles Leong and Dublin driver Alex Denning fend off their rivals to take a hard-won victory in Shanghai race two after taking second place in race one
- Three race wins out of four, extending the championship lead for SJM Theodore Racing

(Macau, 27 May 2025) Iconic Asian motorsports team SJM Theodore Racing, supported by Macau's integrated resort group SJM Resorts, S.A. ("SJM"), achieved sensational results in the second round of the 2025 Lamborghini Super Trofeo Asia ("LSTA") that took place in Shanghai between 16 to 18 May, securing a first-place victory in race two after finishing second in race one. Macau's talented driver Charles Leong Hon Chio and teammate Alex Denning from Dublin showcased impressive teamwork and strategy throughout the weekend, further extending their championship lead. SJM Theodore Racing has recorded three wins and a second place from the first four races in LSTA.

Ms. Daisy Ho, Managing Director of SJM, remarked "We are immensely proud to see SJM Theodore Racing leading the championship after two outstanding rounds, shining a light on Macau's motorsport heritage on the international stage. It is deeply rewarding to witness the team's growth, built on years of our investment in nurturing home-grown talent. Thrilled about the outstanding achievement of the team, Theodore team principal Teddy Yip Junior said: "The weekend has been amazing for all the team, in some ways better than Sydney in the way the team has responded to every challenge they have faced and come up with solutions that led to a win and a second place finish to extend the series lead. It bodes well for the season in the manner in which we continued to extract further performance from the car throughout the weekend and were able to produce the lap times, strategy and on track race craft to give SJM Theodore Racing another weekend to remember."

Leong said: "I'm really happy we got a P1 even though we were struggling a bit with pace. It was a nice defence until the end. We made no mistakes and everyone pulled together as a team, so it was really, really positive and, ultimately, we have extended our championship lead. I'm looking forward to the next round in Fuji, I really want to continue the wins and show what we are capable of."

Denning said: "We're absolutely delighted coming away with the win. It's a credit to all of SJM Theodore Racing, all the work that has been done behind the scenes and to come out with such a strong result in such difficult circumstances."

As a longstanding partner of Theodore Racing, SJM is committed to advancing motorsport development in Macau and nurturing future talents like the homegrown driver Charles Leong.

The partnership aims to leverage Theodore Racing's rich history in motorsports, promoting Macau's motorsport legacy and showcasing the city's talents on the international stage.

The six-round, 12-race LSTA season began at the Sydney Motorsport Park in Australia in April. The drivers will then take on Japan's legendary Fuji International Speedway from 27 to 29 June. Round four is at the South Korean venue of Inje from 18 to 20 July and the penultimate round of the series is set for Malaysia's Sepang Circuit. The season concludes in Italy at Misano from 6 to 7 November, venue of both the final LSTA round of the year and the annual Lamborghini Super Trofeo World Finals, a season-closing showdown between Super Trofeo competitors from the European, North American and Asian series.
